



**Resolution Requesting NC DOT
Install Crosswalks at Outer Banks Fishing Pier and at Nags Head Fishing Pier**

WHEREAS, The Town of Nags Head places a high value on the public health, safety, and welfare of our citizens and visitors; AND

WHEREAS, Both Outer Banks Fishing Pier and the Nags Head Fishing Pier attract pedestrians and vehicles throughout the year; AND

WHEREAS, The Board recently adopted an ordinance amending the Traffic Control Map prohibiting parking on the west side of SR 1243 80' north and south of Isabella Street Beach Access next to the Outer Banks Fishing Pier due to the congestion of vehicles and pedestrians; AND

WHEREAS, One of the parking lots for the Nags Head Fishing Pier is located on the west side of NC 12 – across from the Pier's main parking lot; AND

WHEREAS, People crossing the roadways to both piers risk being struck by vehicles in both high-traffic areas – especially during the summer months.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Nags Head Board of Commissioners respectfully requests that the NC Department of Transportation install crosswalks on SR 1243 (S Old Oregon Inlet Road) at the Outer Banks Fishing Pier and on NC 12 at the Nags Head Fishing Pier in the interest of preventing harm to the walking public.
