



**RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF APPLICATION FOR NORTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF  
TRANSPORTATION GRANT FUNDS TO COMPLETE A COMPREHENSIVE PEDESTRIAN PLAN FOR THE  
TOWN OF NAGS HEAD, NORTH CAROLINA**

**WHEREAS**, two Town wide public surveys, conducted within the last 3 years, identify pedestrian and bicycle connectivity and safety as a critical need; AND

**WHEREAS**, there has been an average of 11 pedestrian/vehicle collisions resulting in a tragic loss of life and injuries in Nags Head over the past five years and this is an accident rate the Town hopes to lower; AND

**WHEREAS**, the 2010 Land Use Plan states that the "Town will review and update the Nags Head Pedestrian Transportation System Plan adopted on November 6, 1996," as a "high priority" objective; AND

**WHEREAS**, the Town's efforts to improve pedestrian safety over the past five years include extending the US 158 multi-use path, remarking crosswalks throughout the Town to improve their visibility, and lobbying the NCDOT for engineering improvements at intersections to enhance safety for pedestrians; AND


**WHEREAS**, The 2011 Parks and Recreation Plan recommends the Town "continue to phase-in completion of the US Highway 158 multi-use trail, maintain the Beach Road trail, and the develop a cohesive and comprehensive pedestrian plan which promotes connectivity and safety in conjunction with NCDOT"; AND

**WHEREAS**, the North Carolina Department of Transportation's Bicycle and Pedestrian Grant Initiative is a matching grant program that encourages municipalities to develop comprehensive bicycle and pedestrian plans.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Nags Head Board of Commissioners authorizes staff to submit a grant application to the North Carolina Department of Transportation requesting funds through the Bicycle and Pedestrian Planning Grant Initiative in the amount of \$24,000 and agrees to match the grant with \$6,000 in local funds in the next fiscal year if the grant is approved in order to complete a comprehensive pedestrian plan at a cost of \$30,000 to improve connectivity, safety and parks and recreation and health benefits for our community.

Upon motion of Mayor Oakes, seconded by Comr. Cahoon, said resolution was unanimously passed.
