



**TOWN OF NAGS HEAD  
BOC ACTIONS  
August 18, 2010**

1. Call to order - Mayor Oakes called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.
2. Agenda – The Board adopted the agenda with “ATV’s crossing State highways” and “Vehicle For Hire ordinance” items removed.
3. Mayor Pro Tem Gray – was not present due to a family member surgery.
4. Audience Response - No one spoke during Audience Response.
5. Beach Road Committee – Andy Garman and Susie Walters (co-chairs) - It was Board consensus to agree with/approve the Committee’s requests to establish five (5) districts (Art District, Community Center/Bonnett St District, Historic District, Municipal District, and Whalebone District) and to approve working with staff on the signage design/size and estimated costs.
6. Town 50<sup>th</sup> Birthday Committee/CAC Committee meeting updates – John Ratzenberger, Chair of the Town’s 50<sup>th</sup> Birthday Committee and the Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) provided updates.
7. Beach Nourishment Project – Highlights:
  - Signatures/addresses will be validated as petitions are returned from property owners
  - Title work is to be provided as necessary for ownership
  - Petition is to be on the Town’s web site for downloading
  - Graphic shoreline progression to be included with mailing of petition
  - Number of returned petitions and associated property values to be posted on Town’s web site
  - Board approved Financial Advisor Contract with verbiage “Payment is not due until project is funded.”
  - The draft Petition was approved by the Board
8. Sandbags - Coastal Resource Commission future of sandbags meeting scheduled for September 2<sup>nd</sup> in New Bern - It was Board consensus that Mayor Oakes suggest that innovative technologies to replace sandbags be researched - It was Board consensus that sandbags on the oceanfront be discussed/finalized at the September 1<sup>st</sup> Board meeting.
9. Town Manager Ogburn - Fire Chief Kevin Zorc reported on the recent National Park Service (NPS) meeting concerning alternative transportation strategies; he summarized the items that affect Nags Head.
10. Town Manager Ogburn - Public Works Director Dave Clark provided an update on the Town’s recycling program. The Outer Banks Hauling company offers a seasonal program – for as short as a three-month period.

- 11.** Town Manager Ogburn - It was Board consensus that Comr. Sadler, at tomorrow's DCTB meeting, request that the DCTB promote/fund two (2) sites – for a Kill Devil Hills and for a Nags Head – Fourth of July 2011 fireworks display – not as a specific grant but to be included in the DCTB annual budget – in the amount of \$25K each.
- 12.** Town Manager Ogburn – Town Manager Ogburn provided a brief positive update from the Town Auditor who recently completed the Town's audit. A detailed report will follow at the Board's November 2010 meeting.
- 13.** Comr. Cahoon – Prior to the next summer season, Comr. Cahoon would like to see an ordinance that prohibits segway use on the Town's multi-use paths brought back for Board consideration.
- 14.** Comr. Sadler – Center for Cultural Interchange (CCI) sponsors international students – the students have volunteered to clean Bonnett/Hargrove Street beach accesses on Thursday, August 19<sup>th</sup>; Comr. Sadler thanked Sonic, Dairy Queen, and Harris Teeter for donating food/drink items to the students.
- 15.** Comr. Sadler – In response to Beach Road Committee presentation earlier in the evening, there is a lot of information on the web re: events that take place in Nags Head and it would be nice to be able to link from the Town's web site to those events.
- 16.** Mayor Oakes - Village at Nags Head POA letter - The Board passed a motion to authorize staff to begin the process for the Village C-2 Commercial District signage zoning ordinance amendment.
- 17.** Adjournment - The Board adjourned at 9:25 p.m.
