BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS


Nags Head is governed by a mayor and four board members elected to staggered, four-year terms.

The Board meets the first Wednesday of each month at 9 am in the Board of Commissioners room at 5401 South Croatan Highway. A mid-month meeting, if needed, is held the third Wednesday of each month, also at 9 am. Meeting dates are subject to change, though this occurs rarely. The most current meeting information is on the calendar at NagsHeadNC.gov. Agendas are posted to NagsHeadNC.gov/BOCAgenda the Friday before each meeting. Meetings are livestreamed and a recording is available for viewing at YouTube/TownofNagsHead.

UTILITIES

WATER SERVICE

The Town provides water service to businesses and residences. New owners must complete a New Owner Water Service Application (required), a Social Security Number Attachment (voluntary), and pay a deposit on their first bill. The forms, and more information, can be found at NagsHeadNC.gov/NewWaterAccount.

Customers can sign up for automatic ACH payments, change billing information, learn about leak adjustments, close accounts, or get further information at NagsHeadNC.gov/Water.

TAXES

Your Nags Head property's tax bill is mailed in July or August each year. Payment is due by September 1 and late fees begin January 6. In addition to Nags Head, Dare County also levies a tax on personal and real estate property; therefore, you will also receive a bill from Dare County. It is up to the property owner to ensure tax bills are forwarded to their mortgage company.

To calculate your property tax, multiply your house value (found on [Dare County's web site](#)) by the tax rate (town and county rates), then divide by 100.

Property owners must annually list personal and business property (e.g., boats, trailers, campers) and real property improvements (e.g., decks, pools) with Dare County. The county mails forms to those who have previously listed. Failure to list during the designated period incurs a 10% personal property tax penalty.



TRASH AND RECYCLING

Our Public Services Department provides weekly residential and commercial trash collection, bulk and brush disposal collection, and two recycling centers. Curbside collection of recyclables is provided by TFC Recycling (TFCRecycling.com) for a nominal fee.

Blue Route

Trash Collected Mondays and Thursdays



All properties fronting the west side of South Virginia Dare Trail and those east of South Virginia Dare Trail, all properties south of Bark and Bainbridge Streets near Mile Post 11.5 that lie between South Virginia Dare Trail and US 158/South Croatan Highway, all properties in the Village at Nags Head, including those on the west side of South Croatan Highway, and all properties either on South Old Oregon Inlet Road or adjacent to it.

Green Route

Trash Collected Tuesdays and Fridays



All properties west of US 158/South Croatan Highway (except the Village at Nags Head), all properties north of Bark and Bainbridge Streets near Mile Post 11.5 that lie between South Virginia Dare Trail and US 158/South Croatan Highway, and properties accessed from US 64.



CURBSIDE RECYCLING

Curbside collection of recyclables takes place Mondays and is provided by TFC Recycling (TFCRecycling.com) for a nominal cost. To encourage recycling, the Town subsidizes the cost to subscribers by \$78/year.

The Town also has two 24/7 recycling drop off centers: at Town Hall at 5401 South Croatan Highway and at Public Services at 2203 Lark Avenue.

CART ROLLOUT SERVICE

From May 1 through October 31, trash and recycling carts for properties with driveways on South Virginia Dare Trail and South Old Oregon Inlet Road are managed by a Town contractor, Trash Detail, for a fee paid by the property owner. Trash Detail personnel roll a property's sanitation carts from the home to the streetside the afternoon before collection and return them to the home after collection. BULK TRASH/BRUSH DISPOSAL

The Town's Public Services department provides two options for bulk and brush disposal: curbside collection, available October 1 through April 30 each year, and a drop off yard, available year round, with a permit. For more information, visit NagsHeadNC.gov/BulkTrash.

POLICE

Nags Head's full service police department provides patrol, criminal investigation, and animal control services. The department, emphasizing proactive policing and building community relationships, provides several services:

- Bicycle registration
- Neighborhood events such as National Night Out and Coffee with a Cop
- Community Watch
- Medicine drop
- E-Commerce safe site (at Town Hall)

Officers and support staff work tirelessly to help make the town a better, safer place to live, work, and visit.



FIRE AND OCEAN RESCUE

Nags Head Fire and Ocean Rescue provides fire, rescue, emergency medical first response, hazardous materials response, fire investigation, community risk reduction, and public education to the community. Two fire stations and an ocean rescue station are located strategically in the town, to enable the most effective services possible.

The department offers a number of programs on fire, ocean rescue, and medical safety. For more information, call 252-441-5909.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

We strive to be good stewards of our environment. To this end, we provide services and programs that assist our property owners in protecting the town's critical natural resources and coastal ecosystem.

SEPTIC HEALTH/ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING

Approximately 80% of the properties in Nags Head use an on-site sewage system, also known as a septic system. There is no mandatory requirement to maintain or repair these systems after they've been installed. But, they can naturally fail due to age, overuse, or improper use and must be maintained to function properly and extend the system's life.

To maintain our local water quality, the Town's Todd D. Krafft Septic Health Initiative offers free services and financial assistance for having these systems pumped, repaired, or replaced.

OCEAN SAND RELOCATION/ DUNE PLANTING

The Sand Relocation Program allows oceanfront property owners to relocate accumulated wind-blown sand back onto the dunes and ocean beach. More information can be found at NagsHeadNC.gov/SandRelocation. A cost-share program is also available to encourage oceanfront property owners to take an active part in dune management through planting native dune vegetation, installing sand fencing, and hiring contractors to relocate sand back to the beach. Nags Head's coastline is beautiful, but it is also fragile. To restore and preserve our coastline, we implement important beach nourishment projects that are critical to the future of our community. BEACH AND SOUND

ON OUR BEACH...

- Dogs **must** be on leashes.
- If you **dig a hole**, fill it in when you're done. **Beach holes can be dangerous** - keep them shallow.
- Balloons are prohibited from being released on any Town-owned property, any waters within the Town's zoning jurisdiction, and the beaches and dune areas.
- Tents/canopies **cannot be larger than 12x12** in area or **taller than 10 feet**.
- Keep the **Emergency Drive Lane** at the base of the dunes clear for first responders.
- Listen to the lifeguards & be mindful of **rip currents**. Remember, double red flags mean **NO SWIMMING**.
- Items left unattended** on the beach **between 8PM & 6AM** will be considered litter and **will be removed**.
- Take your trash** with you.

Do not tie tents/canopies together - they must be no closer than 10 feet apart.

KEEP OFF DUNES

SAFETY

Warning flags are posted at Nags Head's public beach accesses to notify swimmers of hazards such as rough conditions and increased rip currents.

- Yellow – Medium hazard. Moderate surf and/or currents are present. Weak swimmers are discouraged from entering the water. For others, enhanced care and caution should be exercised.
- Red – High hazard. Rough conditions such as strong surf and/or currents are present. All swimmers are discouraged from entering the water. Those entering the water should take great care.
- Double Red – Water is closed to public use. Swimming in the Atlantic Ocean shall be unlawful. The term "swimming" is defined to mean and include any entry into the water of the Atlantic Ocean whether assisted by a raft, float, or other aid or device commonly used, but shall not include any entry assisted by a "surfboard" or "body board and fins."

BEACH DRIVING

Four-wheel drive, state-inspected vehicles, with a Town of Nags Head permit, are allowed on our beach from October 1 through April 30 each year from thirty minutes prior to sunrise through thirty minutes after sunset. A current registration and a driver's license are required to purchase a permit.

Nags Head property owners/residents can purchase a \$50 per season permit available only at our town hall. Proof of Nags Head property ownership or residency, such as a driver's license or tax or water bill, is required.

Those who do not own property in Nags Head can purchase a \$100 per season permit at Nags Head's local tackle shops, Nags Head's town hall, or online, if you have a printer. The printed online receipt must be placed on the driver's side dash until the sticker is received in the mail. Phone receipts are not acceptable.

BEACH PIT FIRES

Beach pit fires are allowed on the beach in Nags Head with a permit. Permits are issued between 5:30 p.m. and midnight daily based on current wind speed and fire danger conditions. Permits are valid the day of issue only, through midnight, and are valid only in Nags Head. More information is available at NagsHeadNC.gov/BeachPitFires.



BEACH WHEELCHAIRS

Beach wheelchairs are available all year by reservation at Fire Station 16. Wheelchairs can also be rented from local equipment rental companies. Call Nags Head Fire and Rescue at 252-441-5909 for more information.

Please remember we do not deliver these chairs, so you need to be able to transport it. We recommend a truck as the chairs will not fit in a car or small SUV.



PARKS

DOG PARK

Located on the grounds of the Dare County Recreation Park at 227 West Satterfield Landing Road, Nags Head's dog park is free and open to the public. Visit NagsHeadNC.gov/DogPark for more information.



DOWDY PARK

Dowdy Park, at 3005 South Croatan Highway, offers inclusive playground equipment, an exercise trail, sport courts, fitness classes, farmer's markets, movie nights, and concerts. SKATE PARK

Located on the YMCA premises at 3000 South Croatan Highway, the skate park is free and open to the public from 8 am through 9 pm or sunset, whichever occurs first. The park is unsupervised; users skate at their own risk. Visit NagsHeadNC.gov/SkatePark for more information.



TOWN PARK

Located off South Croatan Highway at Mile Post 11, turn west onto Barnes Street and you'll find this park nestled in the trees. A playground and a large grass open area makes the space ideal for birthday parties or cookouts. The park's pavilion can be reserved by calling town hall at 252-441-5508. WHALEBONE PARK

Across from Jennette's Pier near Mile Post 16, Whalebone Park boasts a nautical-themed playground, with shaded picnic tables, a bocce court, and volleyball court. More park information is available at NagsHeadNC.gov/WhalebonePark.

PATHS

Nags Head has two multi-use paths and several sidewalks to make biking and walking around town safer. The eleven mile oceanside path stretches from the Nags Head/Kill Devil Hills line south on South Virginia Dare Trail and South Old Oregon Inlet Road. A similar path runs along most of the west side of US 158 (South Croatan Highway).



NAGS HEAD WOODS PRESERVE

Home to one of the largest remaining maritime forests on the East Coast, Nags Head Woods is the perfect place to hike and spend a quiet day. Managed by The Nature Conservancy, the hiking trails can be accessed from Ocean Acres Drive in Kill Devil Hills or from Nags Head's Town Park. The **Arts and Culture Committee** assists the Board of Commissioners in promoting, encouraging, and increasing support for the town's artistic and cultural assets. The Committee meets on the second Wednesday of each month at 12 pm in the Board of Commissioners Room. NagsHeadNC.gov/ArtsandCulture

The **Board of Adjustment** is a "quasi-judicial" board that hears and decides variance requests and interpretations of the Town's land use ordinances or zoning map. The Board meets on an as-needed basis at 9 am on the second Thursday of each month in the Board Room. NagsHeadNC.gov/Adjustment

Community Watch brings police and residents together to increase safety, security, and improve quality of life. Meetings are held the second Tuesday of each month at 6 p.m. in the Board Room. NagsHeadNC.gov/CommunityWatch

The **Dangerous Animal Appeal Board** provides an opportunity to appeal the Police Chief's declaration that a dog is "dangerous" or "potentially dangerous." The Board meets as needed. NagsHeadNC.gov/DangerousAnimalAppeal

The **Personnel Grievance Panel** provides an additional venue for the fair hearing and resolution of employee grievances and appeals in a procedure free of recrimination. The Panel meets on an as-needed basis. NagsHeadNC.gov/PersonnelGrievance

The **Planning Board** is an advisory board that reviews site plans, subdivision plats, special use applications, and all amendments relating to zoning. They then make recommendations to the Board of Commissioners. The Board meets on the third Tuesday of each month at 9 am in the Board Room. NagsHeadNC.gov/PlanningBoard
